## Meet Our Guest Preacher

The Rev. Dr. Marguerite C. Alley graduated from James Madison Univ. with a degree in Music Education. She began her 30+ year career as a Stringed Instrument Specialist. She is a cellist and has performed with the Virginia Beach Symphony, Symphonicity, The Virginia Symphony, and several other regional orchestras. Most of her teaching career has been spent in Virginia Beach in a host of elementary, middle and high schools.

Along the way, she collected a few extra degrees including a Master of Pastoral Studies (Loyola, New Orleans), a Master of Counseling ( William and Mary), a Certificate of Advanced Studies from the Diaconal Formation Program of the Diocese of North Carolina at Duke University which lead to her ordination in 1998 as a Deacon in the Episcopal Church. Most recently, Marguerite earned a Doctor of Ministry with a concentration in Liturgy from the Graduate Theological Foundation. For the past 20 years she has served as deacon in the Episcopal church where she preaches and teaches regularly in addition to challenging the church to “be the church” in the world. She currently serves at St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church in Norfolk.
